

The focus of this article is to examine the various issues of high value GB stamps, commonly known as Seahorses, which were overprinted for use in Ireland during its transition, from the Provisional Government period onto its recognition as the Irish Free State and beyond.

The main use of high value stamps can be summarised as follows - 2/6 & 5s. airmail packets, customs duties, parcel post and the 10s. for telegraph fees. Whereas with low value stamps from ½d. to 1s. Ireland released dedicated definitive stamps, on diverse dates from December 1922 through to December 1923, due to a low demand high value overprinted Seahorse stamps remained in use in Ireland until September 1937.

The objective of this first article is to enable Philatelists, who are collectors of Irish material, to distinguish the various issues, in terms of the basic stamp and the overprint characteristics and to gain basic background information.

PROVISIONAL GOVERNMENT OVERPRINT ISSUES 3T & 7T

GB 2/6, 5s. & 10s. high value stamps were printed by Bradbury, Wilkinson & Sons in sheets of 40 stamps.

ISSUE 3T

Date of release 1922 (February 17)

Four line overprint with black ink by the Dollard Printing House using a 4 x 5 stereo setting, which required two press passes to overprint a full 4 x 10 pane.

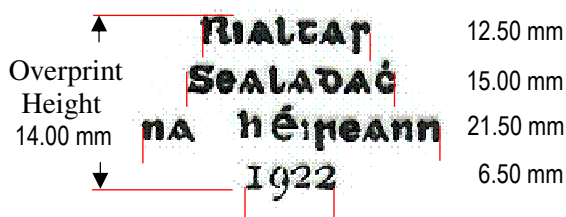

Date of release 1922 (October 17 - 25)

Four line overprint with shiny blue-black ink by Alex. Thom & Co. using an integral 4 x 10 stereo, enabling a full sheet to be printed with one press pass. Thom overprint bolder & sharper compared with Issue 3T.

Features - close setting of 'h' and é of 'hÉireann'.

After twelve months the 26 counties in Ireland, under the terms of the independence treaty, were duly recognised as forming the Irish Free State. To reflect its change of status the overprint was reworded to read “Free State Ireland 1922”, a translation from the Gaelic “Saorstát Éireann 1922”. Both low value and high value stamps were released with the new three line overprint from December 1922 to January 1923.

IRISH FREE STATE OVERPRINT ISSUES 9T, 11T, 12T, 13T

GB 2/6, 5s. & 10s. high value stamps were printed by Bradbury, Wilkinson & Sons in sheets of 40 stamps.

Three line overprint with shiny blue-black ink by Alex. Thom & Co. using an integral 4 x 10 stereo.

Features - all values display a squared foot to the ‘1’ and with a more rounded top to the ‘9’ of ‘1922’.

- T59 panel frame line above the ‘AL’ of ‘HALF’ worn.
- T60 the helmet visor occurs with and without a break.
- T61 the ‘S’ in ‘POSTAGE’ occurs, both in a broken and perfect state.

ISSUE 11T

Date of release 1925 (August 25), with take up by Somerset House in 1926 (February)

Three line narrow overprint setting with glossy black ink initially undertaken by the Government Printing House at Dublin Castle, onto the Inland Revenue Stamping Department at Somerset House, London, at the insistence of the British Government. Stereo setting made up of 20 clichés arranged in five alternate rows, therefore to overprint a full sheet of 40 stamps, two press passes were necessary.

- alternate rows commonly display light dull and more intense glossy ink overprint impressions.
- T66 occurs with panel frame line above ‘AL’ of ‘HALF’ worn and repaired.
- T66 occurs with a broken & perfect ‘R’ in ‘CROWN’.
- T68 occurs with a broken & perfect ‘S’ in ‘POSTAGE’.

ISSUE 12T

Date of release 1927 (May & June)

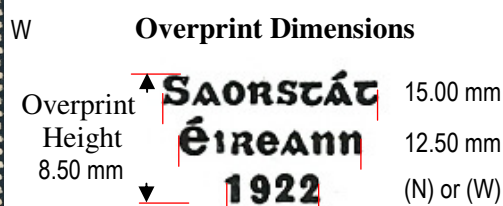
Three line 'Composite' overprint using black ink by Somerset House.

Stereo setting made up of 20 clichés arranged in five alternate rows, requiring two press passes to overprint a full sheet of 40 stamps, were in use with normal composite settings. However in the case of abnormal stereo settings it is promulgated that Somerset House undertook a few trial printings, adopting the use of a 40 cliché stereo, which was to be adopted for Issues 13T & 14T - hence the non repetitive occurrence of wide and narrow date clichés on alternate rows.

This issue is referred to as 'Composite' as it is made up of both wide and narrow date clichés. The reason for this being that initially the setting was all 5.00 mm narrow date clichés, as in use with Issue 11T. However due to wear Somerset House replaced worn clichés, but were inadvertently supplied with wide date (6 mm) clichés from Issue 9T, by the Government Printing Works. Composite settings are known to exist in what is termed a normal setting and for the 2/6 & 5s. values, with scarce abnormal settings, see detail below.

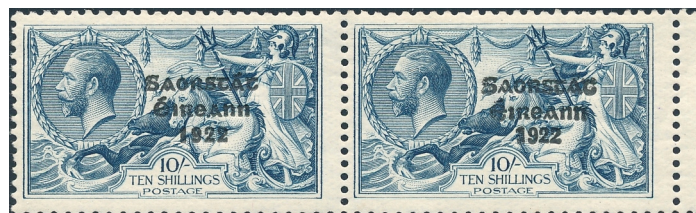

Date of release 1927 (December) to 1928 (February)

Three line overprint, with black ink by Somerset House, using an integral 4 x 10 stereo made up of 40 wide date clichés, enabling a full sheet to be printed with one press pass.

This issue was introduced as the composite overprint stereotypes from Issue 12T were damaged and worn beyond repair.

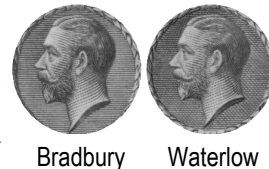

IRISH FREE STATE HIGH VALUE ISSUE 14T

GB 2/6, 5s. & 10s. high value stamps were printed by Waterlow & Sons in sheets of 40 stamps. These printings are easily distinguished from the previous Bradbury series by the background behind the King's portrait. With the Waterlow printings, which are termed 're-engraved' the lines behind the King's portrait consist of cross-hashed horizontal and diagonal lines, whereas the Bradbury printings display only horizontal lines.

Date of release 1935 (March)

Three line overprint, with black ink initially undertaken by Harrison & Sons until July, followed by Somerset House from 1935 (August) until 1937. Stereo & cliché arrangement as per Issue 13T.

EXPLANATORY NOTES - OVERPRINTED 'SEAHORSE' HIGH VALUE STAMPS

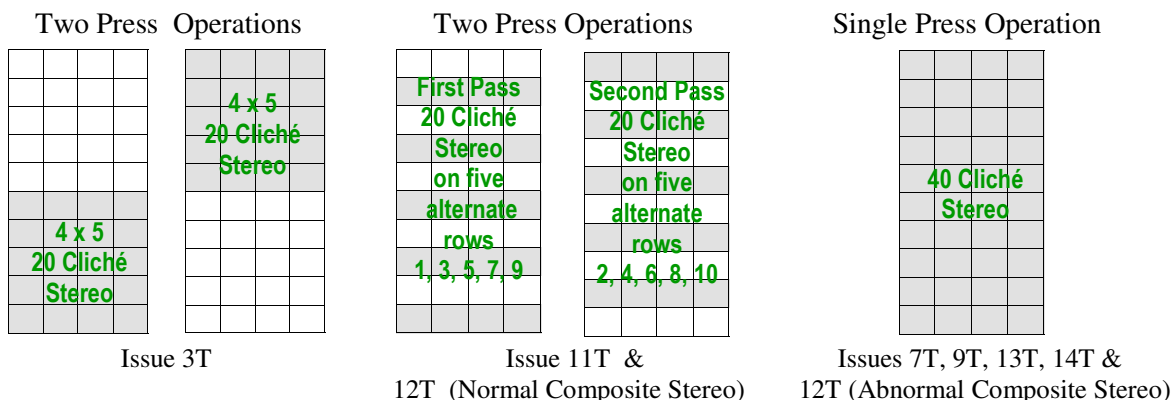
a) In this article the author uses the term issue. Issue numbers are not sequential as low value overprinted stamps were released at different time intervals and follow the same numbering process.

For 'Seahorse' overprints seven issues are examined - being 3T, 7T which are applicable to the Provisional Government period and 9T,11T,12T,13T,14T, which apply to the Irish Free State. Issue numbers follow the Set numbers introduced by David Feldman.

b) Individual stamp 'T' references follow the Feldman allocations, which are now commonly used by Irish philatelists and in the renowned 'Hibernian' Handbook and Catalogue of the Postage Stamps of Ireland.

c) In the main text the term stereo and cliché is widely used. For those with little knowledge of these terms, what follows may help explain meanings, in connection with the overprinting high value sheets, using the letterpress printing process.

Overprint Stereo & Cliché Arrangements



Each cliché displays an overprint inscription in relief, which is either 'Rialtas Sealadac na hÉireann 1922' (for Issues 3T, 7T) or 'Saorstát Éireann 1922' (for Issues 9T,11T,12T,13T,14T).

For issue 3T the first press operation applies overprints to rows 6 to 10 and the second press operation overprints to rows 1 to 5. As a result if overprint variants occur, they will be replicated in the same position in each 4 x 5 stereo. In the case of issue 11T including the normal composite settings from issue 12T, when overprint variants occur they will be replicated on vertically adjacent overprints from alternate rows.

For issues 7T,9T,13T,14T and abnormal overprints from issue 12T, overprint variants, if they occur, will be attributable to specific clichés in a stereo without vertical repetition.

d) For each issue 'Features' are highlighted as they apply to either the stamps or the overprints in a sheet. In the case of stamp features, in most cases, they arise from the use of different printers plates, with a particular value. Printers plates and their individual characteristics, will be set out in a future article.

e) The design of the Seahorse engraved stamps originated from Sir Bertram Mackennal.

Sheets of 40 high value stamps were recess printed in a two pane format, whereby the paper is pressed into the engraved recesses of the printing plates containing the ink.

Bradbury, Wilkinson & Sons used rotary presses to accommodate their curved printers plates which were made from roller dies, which were from the Royal Mint engravers.

Waterlow & Sons for the re-engraved issue 14T, whilst adopting the recess printing process used flat plates, which were also produced from Royal Mint roller dies.

Due to the use of curved and flat plates it is worthy of note that the Bradbury printings display a stamp image which is taller in height 22.6 - 23.1 mm versus that of Waterlow which is shorter, being 22.1 mm. However with Waterlow printings the gutter margin between stamps measures 4.9 mm versus that of Bradbury, which measures 3.9 - 4.2 mm.

All stamps covered in this article display a single cypher watermark, Stanley Gibbons reference W17.

After printing the 4x10 sheets were perforated 11x12, for Post Office counter use, using Grover comb perforating machines.

Note - In this article some explanations reflect the author's opinion, if readers have differing viewpoints they will be welcomed and given mention in future articles.

This second article sets out to list the printers plates in use with the printing of the 2/6, 5s. & 10s. values overprinted for use from the Provisional Government onto the Irish Free State periods.

The article then evaluates the plate features attributable to each issue, culminating with a review of the most significant and recurrent stamp varieties, arising from the plates in use.

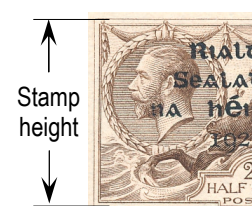

BW PLATE SERIES

Plates from Series I printings were in use from 1919 to 1925 adopting the 'damp printing' process, whilst Series II and III printings in use from 1926 to 1929/30 and 1929/30 to 1934 respectively, adopted the 'dry printing' process.

BW SHEET PERFORATIONS

Panes of 40 (4x10) stamps were perforated by bottom fed (PU) and top fed (PL) sheets into the Grover perforators, see fig 10.

2/6 Stamp Printers Plates:

- Bottom fed (PU) -1, 2/4, 3/5, 7/9, 9/11. • Top fed (PL) 5/7, 6/8.

5s. Stamp Printers Plates:

- Bottom fed (PU) 1/2, 3/4, 5/6. • Bottom & Top fed (PU/PL) 4/5.

10s. Stamp Printers Plates:

- Bottom fed (PU) 1/3, 2/7, 4/9. • Bottom & Top fed (PU/PL) 3/8.

Consistent BW Plate Features

With BW printings the basic stamps for each value display consistent plate features -

2/6 Perfect or Broken 'R' in 'CROWN'.

5s. Complete or Perfect visor in helmet.

10s. Broken or Perfect 'S' in 'POSTAGE'.

It is the author's view when referencing overprinted high value stamps philatelists should acknowledge these features.

This can be simply achieved by the addition of suffix letters, to the basic stamp 'T' references, as follows -

PR - Perfect 'R' or BR - Broken 'R'.

CV - Complete visor or BV Broken visor.

BS - Broken 'S' or PS - Perfect 'S'.

Example

With the introduction of the suffix letters, taking 5s. overprinted stamp T60, as an example. If the stamp displays a complete visor, it arises from plate 1/2, and its reference will be T60CV. Whereas with a broken visor it occurs with plates 3/4, 4/5, 5/6 and its reference will T66BV.

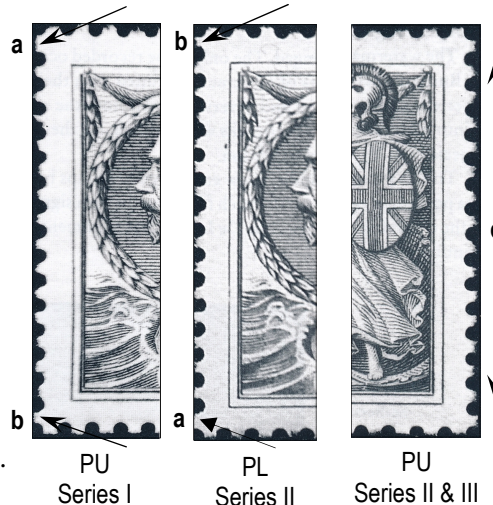

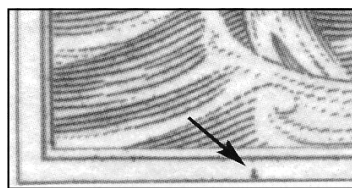

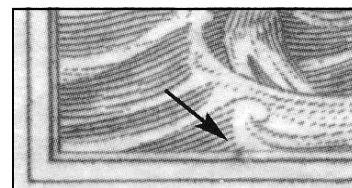

This final article in the series sets out to examine the consistent overprint features encountered with the Provisional Government and the Irish Free State issues, followed by listings and scans of the most significant and recurrent overprint varieties, arising from the various overprint settings in use.

CONSISTENT OVERPRINT FEATURES

Overprint features for each issue in this section apply to all three high values.

ISSUES 3T & 7T

Overprints by Dollard issue 3T and by Thom issue 7T were in use during the Provisional Government period, the overprint scans and basic information is as detailed in the first article. Issue 3T & 7T scans are shown opposite, see figs. 1 & 2.

Distinctive features found with these issues are:

- Dollard overprint line dimensions - 'Rialtar', Sealadac', 'na héireann' are slightly longer compared to the Thom overprints.
- Wider spacing of 'h' and é of héireann with Dollard overprint, compared with Thom.
- Dollard overprints used a black ink, whereas Thom used a shiny blue-black ink and generally the Thom overprints are bolder and sharper.

ISSUES 9T, 11T, 12T, 13T, 14T

Overprints for use during the Irish Free State period were undertaken by four firms, namely - Thom issue 9T, Government Printing Works (GPW), Dublin & Inland Revenue Stamping Department, Somerset House (SH) issue 11T, Somerset House (SH) issues 12T & 13T, Harrison & Sons (HS) and Somerset House (SH) issue 14T.

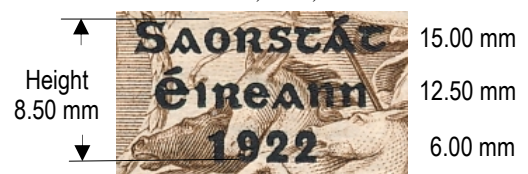


fig. 3 Wide Date

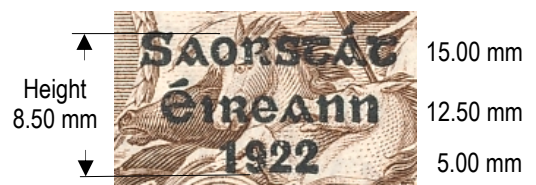


fig. 4 Narrow Date

For five issues the 'Saorstát' and 'heireann' line lengths and overall heights are identical, the difference being the use of either 6mm or 5mm date line '1922' widths, see figs. 3 & 4. In the case of issue 12T, both wide and narrow date clichés were in use, hence its recognition as the 'composite' overprint issue.

Distinctive features found with these issues are:

- Issue 9T - '1' with squared foot and a rounded top to the '9' of '1922', see fig. 3.
- Issue 11T - foot of '1' in '1922' rounded and top of '9' less rounded, see fig. 4.
 - overprints frequently display either dull or more bold overprint impressions on alternate rows, see fig. 5.
 - example shown in fig. 6 clearly demonstrates the overprinting of alternate rows in a pane.

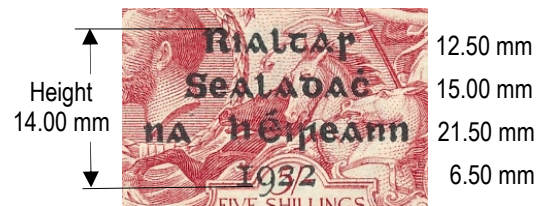

(continued)

- Issue 12T - example shown in fig. 7 displays a normal composite overprint printing made up of a 5 mm and a 6 mm width to the '1922' date line.
This example with the broken 'S' in 'POSTAGE' is from the Bradbury printers plate 3/8L (Series II) - stamp height 23 mm.
- Issue 13T - overprint impressions frequently more intense than earlier issues.
- common occurrence of a small ink dot between the 'S' and 'a' of 'Saorstát', see fig. 8.
- Issue 14T - common occurrence of a small ink dot between the 'S' and 'a' of 'Saorstát', see fig. 8.

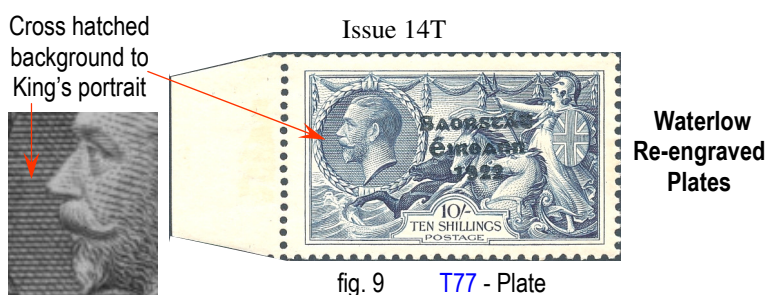


fig. 9 T77 - Plate

Overprint characteristics from issues 13T and 14T are identical. Overprints from issue 14T were applied to Waterlow & Sons re-engraved stamps, which are easily distinguishable from the earlier Bradbury & Wilkinson stamps, see fig. 9.



fig. 7 T71vBS - Plate 3/8R

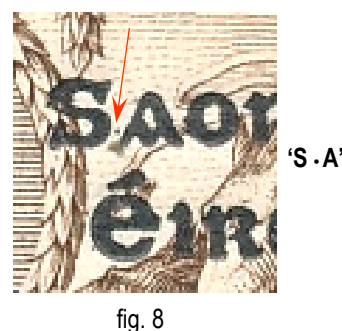

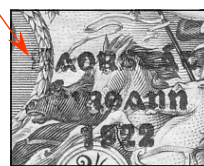

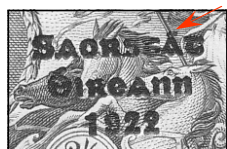
